CAPE FUND - Project Story



Early Identification and Intervention of Patients/Residents with Nutritional Risks in the Community

Funded by CAPE, this community project was developed due to the prevalence of malnutrition in hospitalised patients which originated in the community, often leading to adverse clinical outcomes. Lack of resources, care continuity and knowledge gaps are potential barriers to early community support. Toa Payoh Care Corner Senior Activity Centre (SAC) and Touch Community Services (TCS) were community partners who shared the same vision in our collaboration. Virtual training and resources were developed to build their capability to support residents' nutrition.

Community nutrition screening protocol was implemented to enable early risk identification, provide first line nutrition support and monitor, prior to direct referral to dietitian for a more comprehensive nutritional assessment and intervention. Co-consultation for the residents were conducted with our partners via home visits or centre-based dietitian posts to further empower them. At the end of the project, 75 residents at Toa Payoh Blk 5 had completed the nutrition screening process and there were 17 direct referrals to community dietitian from SAC and TCS. Our community partners were also empowered to follow up on some of these residents for subsequent monitoring and reinforcement.

This pilot project to develop a community dietitian care model has demonstrated the need, receptiveness and value for direct access to a community dietitian.

Feedback from community partners have been very positive. We will continue to refine our care model with our existing and new partners to ensure accessibility and sustainability, including enhancing community-based nutrition strategies such as food ration programs, meal delivery service, and centre-based meal programs.
