Simple understanding of how Diabetes affect the feet:

Why is it important to care for the foot in diabetes?

Poorly controlled diabetes may result in **poor blood circulation** and **loss of sensation**.

Implications



Loss of Sensation:

You may feel numbness or feeling less or not pain when there is an injury/cut



Poor blood flow:

Delayed or non-healing wounds, as well as gangrene



High risk of infection and amputation when problems are **not addressed early**
Seek help early
