

Preparation Checklist

Before Your Review:

- Think of any questions you have about your medications
- Write down your questions and concerns
- If there is someone who helps you manage your medications at home, ask them along for the review

On the Day of Your Medication Review:

Bring **ALL** your medications, including:

- Medications that are purchased on your own or given by hospitals / private clinics
- Over-The-Counter medications
- Supplements
- Traditional Medicine / Herbal products
- Records of self-monitoring of blood pressure, blood glucose (if any)
- Pill-boxes you use to organise your medications

Medication review can help you better understand your medications, answer any questions you have about your medications and enable you to take charge of your health.

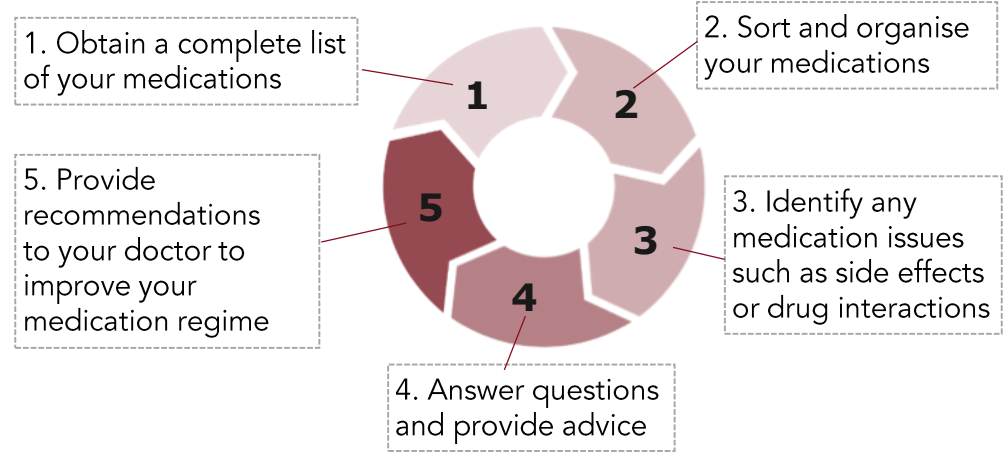
Who Can Benefit?
