Associate Professor Prabha Unny Krishnan, Senior Consultant from Laboratory Medicine is well recognised and respected in the healthcare fraternity in Singapore. As Head of Laboratory Medicine (2006-2015), she was professionally responsible for establishing satellite laboratories and 24/7 laboratory services during outbreaks of infectious diseases and expanded the capability of the main laboratory to manage surge in other investigations. As a founding member of the Network of Antimicrobial Resistance Surveillance, she collated national antibiotic susceptibility data from all restructured hospitals in Singapore, enabling testing and reporting structures to be standardised across all hospitals.



# From Hospital to Community

Breaking Ground on Tomorrow's Healthcare





#### March 2017

The groundbreaking of the Integrated Care Hub (ICH) marks the beginning of construction of another component of HealthCity Novena. ICH, slated to open in 2022, will bring together all levels of rehabilitation and step-down care into a single building, with a focus on four care streams - Primary, Community, Intermediate, and End-of-Life – within an environment that empowers and encourages healing. This will allow TTSH to more holistically enable our patients to return to their homes, to work and their daily lives in the community.

### A New Strategy for Community Health October 2017

Our first Community Health Team, providing continuing care for the Ang Mo Kio zone, was formed following the establishment of Central Health. The team is the first of the pilot Community Health Teams providing continuing care to residents in the central region of Singapore. The team will serve as a bridge from and back to the hospital, integrate and coordinate allied health and medical care for patients, and network with our care partners. The work done by this group will be used as a model for the teams to be formed for the other six zones.

TTSH is the first hospital in Singapore to introduce

a new procedure – Navigational Bronchoscopy, that allows doctors to pinpoint cancer in the lungs more accurately, leading to faster diagnosis and treatment of Singapore's No. 1 killer cancer. The new procedure is a virtual reality and a GPS-guided system which aids in finding and extracting suspected cancer cells in the lungs, more efficiently than traditional methods.

## Volunteerism – Powering Change in Health and Social Care October 2017

This year's Singapore Patient Conference was back on a bigger scale and oversubscribed – attracting close to 1,500 participants. 50% of them were patients, caregivers and volunteers, with the rest being healthcare professionals from public healthcare institutions and Voluntary Welfare Organisations. New this year was the SPC in the Community Charity Walk and Health Carnival held on 30 September, in support of the World Hospice and Palliative Care Day, and #WalkForPall movement. We clocked more than 190km, raising funds for a meaningful cause.
